

A NOTE FROM PASTOR GRANT

Hello Grace Family,

As we enter this New Year, I felt it would be appropriate for us to pause and consider one of the many Hebrew words we find in the Bible for worship. The word is: **Barauch**

Barauch is translated "to kneel or bow as an act of adoration." In other words, we kneel or bow as an expression of our fervent and devoted love for the Father. When we kneel or bow, we are humbling ourselves.

Remember: "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble. Therefore submit to God..." James 4:6, 7

The Apostle Peter reminds us that "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble. Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you." 1 Peter 5:5-7

To *humble myself* is to *cast all my cares* upon the Father. To *submit* all my concerns to Him. To *trust* that He will work out all things for good. *Barauch* then, is to express an attitude of love, submission and trust through the act of kneeling or bowing.

King David exemplified *Barauch* when he wanted to build the temple. In 1 Chronicles 28 & 29 King David makes the following statements: "I had it in my heart", "had made preparations to build it", "I have prepared with all my might" and "I have set my affection on". These statements express his love towards the Father. However, when God told him, "you shall not build a house for My name", David submitted and gave the plans to Solomon whom God had chosen for this work.

Next, David showed his absolute trust in God when he spoke to Solomon and said "Be strong and of good courage, and do it; do not fear nor be dismayed, for the Lord God - my God -will be with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you, until you have finished all the work for the service of the house of the Lord." 1 Chronicles 28:20

Then "David blessed (barauch) the Lord before all the assembly..." and ended his prayer by saying, "now bless (barauch) the Lord your God. So all the assembly blessed (barauch) the Lord God of their fathers, and bowed their heads and prostrated themselves before the Lord and the king." 1 Chronicles 29:10-20

Our loving Father's desire for us is to grow and mature to the point that we are continually giving place to Him in every area of our life. This coming year we can live a lifestyle of **Barauch**. When we kneel or bow we are expressing our love, submission and trust to the Father. While we cannot live life on our knees, we can demonstrate a lifestyle of Barauch through love for one another (John 13:34), by being submissive to one another (1 Peter 5:5), and by having a steadfast heart, trusting in the Lord (Psalm 112:7; Proverbs 3:5, 6). Just as we see the relationship between David and Solomon, we should also realize that we can work together to achieve the goals that the Lord has set before us: "your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions." Joel 2:28b

Blessings for a New Year of mutual cooperation.

"Patience with others is LOVE ... patience with self is HOPE ... patience with God is FAITH." Adel Bestavros

Peter Marshall once prayed ... "Teach us, O lord, the discipline of patience ... for to wait is often harder than to work."

According to the dictionary, *patience* is "the calm endurance of hardship, provocation, pain, delay, etc." That "etc." can include many different hardships, struggles, problems, and weaknesses and each of us have our very own.

I must confess ... I am not a very patient person, and my impatience shows when I am on the golf course waiting for the slow group ahead of me. Or when I am in line at the grocery store or out in traffic. I am sure many share my dilemma. Yet my impatience helps me to recognize just how patient God is with me. As children of the Almighty Father, we are to do what is right, even when we recognize that our choices are wrong. We are slow to grow spiritually as the world and all its distractions have a greater effect on our decision making, rather than God's Word. But our God is a perfect example of patience and He does not give up on any of us. He gives us the presence of His Holy Spirit to show us when we are outside His will, and the direction to help us be the children He desires us to be. Being mindful of my impatience helps me to arm myself with God's Word when situations arise. Read these words from Psalm 37:7, "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him ... do not fret ..." From Romans 12:12 (NRV) we read ... "When you hope, be joyful. When you suffer, be patient and when you pray ... be faithful."

One more thought, and an important one. We need to be *patient with God*. When you are facing challenges, remember God is forever at work in your life. TRUST HIM! Trust Him when the hardest thing for you to do is to trust Him at all. God knows what the situation is that you are facing, and He has a plan that is perfect and if you remain patient, He will show you the way out of whatever trial you're facing. Wait patiently when He doesn't answer your prayers and it seems like He doesn't hear, and the delays are trying and upsetting. BE PATIENT! He knows exactly what to do and when to do it. You'll see ... He will not fail you.

" I can only imagine...

It's a beautiful song by Mercy Me. (Check out the YouTube! https://youtu.be/DUOMwNpRq6M) As I think about the words of this song, it causes me to think ... What will heaven be like? Gone will be our earthly bodies, as will the cancer that has plagued many of us. Gone too will be the pain, the physical handicaps, as will be every type of suffering. There will be no checkbooks, or bills to pay, or financial planning. Gone will be our past and all of the trials and suffering we experienced. All this will be replaced by our eternal future with Jesus Christ our King. Time will not be measured by minutes, hours, days, weeks, or years ... for we are there for all eternity. Gone too will be death and the fear many have of it. None of us know what it will be like to step from life into death, but we need not fear! Sometimes, with sadness, my thoughts turn to my friends and loved ones, those who continue to ignore Christ's invitation, and choose instead to live their lives without Him. WHAT WILL HEAVEN BE LIKE ... and WHAT ABOUT HELL ... what will hell be like? Thank you, Jesus for the assurance we have that we will never experience the likes of it. What is hell like? ... I can't even begin to imagine what it would be like.

Salvation! Heavenly Father, we shout with joy, knowing that Your Son, Jesus, paid the full price for our admittance, dying on the cross for all mankind. We lift up those who don't know this feeling of joy and assurance, and we pray today will be the day they experience it.
