

A NOTE FROM PASTOR GRANT

Dear Grace Family,

I am filled with excitement and anticipation as we continue to venture forward into this New Year and begin to unpack the vision that the Lord has placed on the hearts of the Elders regarding the future of Grace Church. This time-period marks a watershed moment for us as we consider: do we continue in the way we always have, or do we pursue a way that will empower and equip every member to fulfill their purpose and call in Christ?

Possibly the biggest adjustment for us will be our approach to how we make disciples. We are all familiar with the Great Commission in which Jesus commands to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20 ESV).

Unfortunately for many of us, discipleship has been relegated to the period that we gather on a Sunday morning to hear the Word, rather than a lifestyle of connection to the Lord's Word, his Spirit, and his people. In his book "Growing Up", author Robby Gallaty makes this somewhat amusing, but startling comment. He says that "preaching to make disciples is like going to the nursery and spraying crying babies with milk and saying you just fed the kids... discipleship involves more than preaching and listening." He is right; Discipleship is a call to action *with* other believers as we teach, encourage, comfort, and instruct one another in the work of the gospel. He continues by saying that "Jesus measured success by something other than buildings, bodies, and bucks. He taught us that disciple-making is what matters, and it is a process that takes time."

This truth reminds me of this passage from John 3:22 which states that, after meeting with Nicodemus in Jerusalem, "Jesus and his disciples went into the Judean countryside, and **he remained there with them**...". This short passage encompassed a period of about six months! Jesus impressed himself upon his disciples until they bore his indelible image. In their book "Discipleshift", authors Jim Putman and Bobby Harrington echo this idea when they state that "...Jesus invited people into relationships with himself; he loved them and, in the process, showed them how to follow God. **His primary method was life-on-life**."

Our Lord Jesus is calling us back to the lifestyle he exemplified to his disciples during his earthly ministry.

His example has been borne-out in recent research which has been compiled in the book "*The Shape of Faith to Come*" by Dr. Brad Waggoner. The result of their research showed that the top three predictors of ongoing, year-to-year, spiritual growth are:

- 1. Reading the Bible and other Christian literature daily,
- 2. Attending the weekly worship service, and
- 3. Being involved in a small Bible study group.

It will be in our small, intimate groups that we can experience the life-on-life care, support, and community that we so desperately need, especially during this time in which our society works to sow discord and division.

In Genesis chapter one, we read multiple times in which the Lord states that all he had made was *good*. In <u>Genesis 2:18</u>, before sin had entered this good creation, the Lord made this startling statement: "It is NOT GOOD that man should be alone." God in his wisdom designed us for life-on-life fellowship and communion. Let us not resist his call but embrace all that he has in store for us this year and in the years to come.


DO YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW NEED FOOD ASSISTANCE?

What is Your Perspective?

Perspective can be everything. Looking at houses from an airplane window shrinks structures that normally loom large to so many square-shaped specks. Looking at stars through a telescope provides a far more detailed view than what standing in your backyard might provide.

I had an interesting 'lesson' regarding perspective a week ago. As I sat in our study for a quiet time, I decided to put my earbuds in and listen to a worship song. Earbuds are great at drowning out noise from the environment enabling you to be fully engrossed in what you are listening to. I closed my eyes as I was captivated by the worship song, and I could 'see' (in my mind's eye) myself standing on top of a huge mountain. From my perspective I could see wispy clouds and other mountains in the distance. I saw myself with arms outstretched taking in the awesome view. Although I was small in comparison to what I was viewing, I didn't feel insignificant, but I did have an overwhelming sense of God's greatness.

As I continued to enjoy the moment I was experiencing, I began to think about perspective. Sometimes my life can feel less like a mountaintop experience and more like being at the base of a mountain staring up at a towering mass of impossibility. At any given moment, life can throw a seemingly insurmountable obstacle into our lives: a chronic health condition, a failing relationship, an unsaved family member, financial woes, a job loss, death of a loved-one etc. Standing at the foot of the obstacle or challenge can feel overwhelming and even intimidating. We need a different perspective.

I remember hearing the expression "too heavenly minded to be any earthly good".

I always thought this made sense – we must live in the here and now, not with our heads in the clouds. However, on closer inspection, I'm not sure that this saying lines up with scripture.

Colossians 3:1-3 says

"If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God."

Living a life with our minds set on "things above" offers a different perspective.

My "mountaintop" experience served to remind me that I need to trust God to give me *his* perspective in any given situation. Things look far different from the summit than from base camp. That does not take away from the mountains we face in our daily lives – they are real, and they bring with them a variety of challenges: sadness, suffering, grief, doubts, fear... We need to ask God to give us *his* perspective in our situation so that we don't lose sight of who he is, what he might be trying to show us, or how he desires to receive glory in and through our trials. Perhaps the expression should be "SO heavenly minded that we *ARE* earthly good."

So what is your perspective? Let me encourage you to keep your eyes on Jesus – *every* day in *every* circumstance that comes your way. Perspective can be everything.

Realize that God is only a prayer way ... call on Him when you face bad memories of your past ... or worry and concern about your future. Let's finish with Philippians 3:13-14, "... But one thing I do ... forgetting the things which are behind ... and stretching forward to the things that are before ... I press on toward the goal ... unto the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

Lord help us today to keep our eyes fixed on the new day You have given us. Let us keep our eyes fixed on You, our Lord and Savior. Direct our path as we turn this new day over to Your care and keeping. For You are the Anchor of our lives, and You will never fail us.

"Do not be afraid to enter the cloud that is settling down on your life ... God is in it. The other side is radiant with his Glory." L.B. Cowman


When I read the above quote on fear, I did some study and found more than 100 verses (and I am sure there are more) on fear. The Bible recognizes that fear is one of our greatest enemies. Throughout the Old Testament and the New, we find verse after verse on how we are to recognize our fears and how we need to depend on God for help in handling them. I think that even Jesus experienced fear. As he knelt in prayer on the Mount of Olives prior to His betrayal by Judas, He knew of the horrible death that awaited Him and He prayed ... *"Father, if you are willing, take away this cup of suffering."* Fear had it's grip on Him, yet He recognized that His Father was His source of strength, and He prayed ... *"Not my will, but Thy will be done."* (Luke 22:42)

This day may hold something that you greatly fear. As you awake, fear grips you and anxiety fills your mind. Think of this promise from our God who loves you ... *"My grace is sufficient for you... for my strength is made perfect in weakness."* Fear and anxiety is our weakness, and God is fully prepared to provide us the grace we will need to overcome it. J. L. Packer writes ... "Grasp the fact that God is for you. You will find in thus knowing God as your Sovereign Protector, irrevocably committed to you in the covenant (His promise) of grace ... both freedom from fear and new strength for the fight."

One more "fear" verse to share with you from The Message, Isaiah 43:1-4 ... "Don't be afraid! I have redeemed you. I've called your name. You're Mine! When you're in over your head, I'll be there with you. When you're in rough waters, you will not go down. When you're between a rock and a hard place ... it won't be a dead-end... Because I am God, your personal God, the Holy One, your Savior. I paid a huge price for you ... that's how much you mean to Me! That's how much I love you!" Someone once said ... "Courage is not the absence of fear ... it's to feel the fear and face it anyway." We can only do this through the power of God's grace and the promises of His Word.
