

The last chapter in the book entitled, "I am a Church Member" by Thom S Rainer, discusses why we should treasure our church membership.

I admit I had a little trouble understanding the author's direction in this chapter, but after digging in a little further I came to the following conclusion: It begins in our belief of our salvation. Let's look at John 3:16–18,

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him. Whoever believes in Him is not condemned but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God."

If we truly believe that we are saved by the shedding of Jesus blood on the cross, then we must believe He did this to show His love for us. If we believe He loves us that much and we have the desire to live like Christ, then we will want to share our life, our time, our talent and our treasures with others - our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ certainly, but those outside the church as well.

A real-life example of this in my life is the support Lue and I give the Haitian people through LESPWA International. The way Lue Anne came to LESPWA is a story in itself, and it is the thing that led me to be more missions minded.

Lue had been going on mission trips with LESPWA for several years, before I decided to join her on one. She always came home with stories of how lives were being changed, how fellow Christians were working in Haiti and the adventures that went with those trips.

I would choose to stay home, using excuses like "I don't feel God was calling me to Haiti," and "What could I do to help these people out?". When in fact, the Spirit was working on my heart and saying, "Why not you?" and eventually He opened doors for me to say, "It is time".

On Lue's previous trips, she had taken fellow sisters in Christ from our church, our youngest son Kyle and even my mother! When the next trip came up there was a request for someone to help with the technical issues that a few of the Haitian brothers and sisters were experiencing. That sounded like my window of opportunity and the Holy Spirit saying, "It is time." So away we went! That trip convinced me of my need to spend more time with these people - not so much to use my technical skills but rather to encourage them spiritually and financially. They, in turn, have built up my beliefs and stretched me through evangelism and teaching. I have also built lifetime relationships with some of the Haitian men. Some have visited our church. With our help and that of our church, we have gotten some of their families away from the turmoil in Haiti and over to the US. Others still struggle trying to get out, and yet others choose to stay and continue to serve their country and God in Haiti.

You may be wondering what this story has to do with me treasuring my church membership. Here is my take on what I think the author is trying to express and how it fits in: I believe my Savior put a desire in my heart to help people in Haiti. Without my belief in Jesus Christ as my Savior, along with my church membership, I might still be trying to serve God alone. I might be serving Him, while thinking my good works will get me to heaven someday. We all know that would not be true. We know that it is God's love for us that implores us to serve joyfully with full intent on God receiving credit for all that is done.

Jesus prayer for His followers in John 15:9-17 also explains where we find joy,

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love just have kept Father's 1 mv commandments and abide in His love. These things I have spoken to you, that my JOY may be in you and that your JOY may be full. This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants for the servant does not know what his master is doing, but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name He may give it to you. These things I command you, so that you will love one another."

I know I need belief in my salvation, love for my fellow Christians, and church membership to share my stories and help fellow believers going through some of the same struggles. Church membership helps me find likeminded Christians to help support me in my desire to help the people of Haiti; through their prayers, financial gifts, or even just words of encouragement. I believe without my church membership, this desire to serve the Haitian people would have died a long time ago. So I needed my church to help me walk through the doors that were opened and put me in the place God wanted me all along. My belief in God, being able to walk alongside fellow brothers and sisters in Christ and doing the things God intends for me to be doing in His church are what bring me joy.

Finally, what has God put on your heart to help further God's Kingdom? How do you see Grace Evangelical Free Church working alongside you to further God's Kingdom? Have you reached out to find like-minded people in your church? If not, do it! So much joy from the King awaits you when you do.

I believe this is the joy of being a church member, and when you have that joy, you can truly treasure your church membership.

HEY PARENTS!



"Forget the former things, do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Do you not see it?" Isaiah 43:18-19

A young man asked an old man this question, "If you could leave me with one piece of advice, what would it be?" The old man paused for a few moments and then said, "Make mistakes ... But don't regret them. Learn from them, because regrets are the hardest thing to carry when you get older."

So many of us carry sins from our past and, although we have sought God's forgiveness, we continue to carry them with us as baggage on our earthly journey.

God's forgiveness is complete. Romans 4:7-8 insures us that forgiveness is complete, and sins are remembered no more. "Blessed are those whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the one whose sin the Lord will never count against them."

Listen as God reminds you that **He has wiped the slate clean**. Let today be the day you release yourself from the regrets you have been carrying, for God is telling you, "See, I am doing a new thing! Do you not see it!" If **He has released you from your regrets, why shouldn't you do the same?**

I pray you will find strength in His word.
