

# A NOTE FROM PASTOR BRAD

### Grace Family,

When I first arrived in Wisconsin nine years ago, I was expecting to be reasonably well-understood by those who, I thought, also spoke English. Much to my surprise, there were tones and pronunciation that people used in their accents that sometimes made communication a "hit or miss affair". On one such occasion, I was asked by a salesperson whether I wanted "a beg for that?" Since I had just paid for the item, I couldn't understand why I would want to beg for that! After a look of confusion came over me, and the salesperson tried in vain to repeat the question, just a little louder, Beth came to our rescue by saying to me, "do you want a BAG for that?" I responded immediately..." Yes please."

I am sure that most of us have not made it this far through life without having been misunderstood at least once. Most often, being misunderstood is also accompanied by feelings of disappointment, frustration, and perhaps even anger.

If the above is the case, then I would like to suggest that we are in good company. If we look back at the life of Jesus recorded in the Gospels, we find many occasions where Jesus was misunderstood by his listeners, which led them to a variety of misguided feelings and emotions. John 8 records a lengthy conversation with the Jews that ends up in vs. 48, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?" (Ouch! Racial slur, "you're not even a Jew, Jesus, and what's more, you're possessed by Satan!") In John 10:24, Jesus encounters the Jews again when they say, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly." (Read "we doubt that you are, but tell us anyway".) Pilate, likewise, in John 18 asks, "Are you the king of the Jews?" (Can you hear the unspoken thoughts? "... because you're not acting like any king I know".) In John 20, when the disciples, upon reaching the tomb, go inside and find it empty, John records, "for as yet they did not understand the scripture". These are just four incidents where people, who had witnessed the power and wisdom of God in the person of Jesus Christ, did not grasp what they were seeing or hearing in the moment.

So, what was the difference between them - the Jews, Pilate, and the disciples - that led some to repent, believe, and follow, and others to harden their hearts, not believe, and turn their backs on their salvation?

Great question! It is impossible to unequivocally state that there was one thing, but I would point us to the working of Holy Spirit, to the humility that comes through surrender, and to an ongoing relationship with God - even after events took a serious turn for the worse!

It is the same in our personal lives when we are not fully understood by a person in a given situation. As we seek to reach a world that is lost in its sin and without hope in this life, there will be, (and I am sure have been), times when people misunderstand your words or intentions. What is your response to that?

Many people would turn their backs on the person and not bother engaging with them in the future. After all, we reason with ourselves that we tried, and it didn't work. However, if we are to yield to the Holy Spirit, humble ourselves before God in surrender to him, and seek to pursue the relationship for the sake of the other person's state of being, then we must tell God in prayer, "not my will but your will be done." We must act in the way that Jesus encouraged us, as found in Matthew 5 and 6 and "Love our enemy and pray for those who persecute us" or "Go the extra mile" or "Turn the other cheek" or "Forgive others their trespasses." Ultimately, as Paul writes to the church in Romans 12:21, "we are not to overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." But how, we ask? In Romans 13:14, Paul helps us, and I conclude with, "But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires."

# **BON VOYAGE | AN ADVENTURE AWAITS**

This coming October, a team of eight from Grace Church will be traveling to *Nice, France* to partner with missionaries, *Steve & Faye Daniels.Steve & Faye* are Fond du Lac natives, with a passion for seeing French people of all ages encounter Christ and choose to walk in love and obedience to God.

Currently the team consists of: Pastor Grant & Rebekah Baumgart, Hope DelPonte, Lily Hernandez, Ashlianna Murphy, Diane Nick, Rachel Titel, & Leah Tweedy. They are in the midst of fundraising, learning more about France & the French culture, and preparing for the trip.

But why *Nice*? The city of Nice has a population of 300,000 people and is located on the famous *Côte d'Azur* on the Mediterranean Sea. Although, according to the internet, about 50% of people in France say that they are Christian, there is still a great need there for the hope & lasting joy that a relationship with the Lord brings.

Our team will be leaving on Thursday, October 5, 2023, and returning home on Monday, October 16, 2023. During the trip, they will have the opportunity to have engaging conversations at the church-owned outreach café, *Atelier Alfred*. Residents from around the area come to the café to practice their English. While in Nice, the team will also complete some work projects, possibly enjoy "an American Thanksgiving" with the people there, and spend time with Steve & Faye. They will also get some time off to enjoy the sights and sounds of southern France.

This task certainly cannot be accomplished alone! That is why they need your partnership! <u>One of the biggest needs is prayer support.</u>

# The Anchor Holds

"Patience with others is love... patience with self is hope...
patience with God is FAITH." Adel Bestavros

Peter Marshall once prayed, "Teach us, O lord, the discipline of patience, for to wait is often harder than to work." According to the dictionary, *patience* is "the calm endurance of hardship, provocation, pain, delay... etc." That "etc." can include many different hardships, struggles, problems, and weaknesses - and each of us have our very own.

I must confess, I am not a very patient person, and **my impatience** shows when I am on the golf course waiting for the slow group ahead of me! Or when I am in line at the grocery store, or out in traffic. I am sure many share my dilemma. Yet my impatience helps me to recognize just **how patient God is with me!** As children of the Almighty Father, we are to do what is right, even when we recognize that our choices are wrong. We are slow to grow spiritually when the world and all its distractions have a greater effect on our decision making, than God's Word does.

Thankfully, our **God is a perfect example of patience** and He does not give up on any of us. Being mindful of my impatience helps me to arm myself with God's Word when situations arise. Read these words from Psalm 37:7, "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him, do not fret." From Romans 12:12 (NRV) we read, "When you hope, be joyful. When you suffer, be patient and when you pray, be faithful." God gives us this instruction in Colossians 3:12 (NIV) "Therefore as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourself with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience."

One more thought, and an important one. We need to **be patient with God**. When you are facing challenges, remember *God is forever at work in your life*. TRUST HIM! Trust Him when the hardest thing for you to do is to trust Him at all. God knows what the situation is that you are facing, and He has a plan that is perfect and if you remain patient, He will show you the way out of whatever trial you're facing. Wait patiently when He doesn't answer your prayers and it seems like He doesn't hear, and the delays are trying and upsetting. BE PATIENT! He knows exactly what to do and when to do it. You'll see... **He will not fail you.** 

# I will be your God throughout your lifetime, until your hair is white with age. I made you and I will carry you. I will carry you along and save you." Isaiah 46:4
