

### A NOTE FROM PASTOR GRANT

As we approach the busiest shopping season of the year in preparation for Christmas, a common sales tactic comes to mind which I would like to unpack a little: "add-ons", also known as "up-selling".

An *add-on sale* refers to an additional, and often unnecessary, item or service sold to the buyer of a main product or service. Depending on the business, these sales represent a significant source of additional revenue for the company. Salespeople are trained to suggest these add-ons, which usually only cost pennies more for the company to produce, but generate incredible profits. Some examples include:

- "Would you like a drink with your order?"
- "Would you prefer the cooler 17" alloy rims?"
- "Have you considered the extended warranty?"
- "If you add a checked bag NOW it will only be \$50 instead of \$75 at the airport."
- "Did I mention the upgraded leg room for only \$50 per flight?"

What bothers me most about this tactic is the idea or feeling of a "bait and switch" maneuver. I have been baited with an unbelievably low price, then coaxed into spending more. I don't like; it feels dishonest.

So why bring this up now?

As we approach the shopping season, almost every retailer will promise that **joy** will result in your loved ones if you purchase *their* products WITH the obligatory add-ons. **But is this true joy?** 

The answer is to be found in Jesus' words:

These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. <u>John 15:11</u> ESV

Full joy is to be found in our obedience to the Father and our intimate union with Him. This is the purpose for which we were created, and which brings the deepest fulfillment and deepest joy to our lives. Jesus' joy came from such intimacy with the Father and His delight to do that which pleases the One Who is all love and goodness. Jesus is showing how our joy may be complete.

If we have no joy in obedience to the Father's will, then perhaps we should consider whether we know Him as Jesus knows Him. Perhaps we need to ask ourselves what does bring us joy. This answer will begin to reveal the condition of our own hearts.

You see, **true joy** is not to be found in an overpriced trinket with an add-on; it is to be found in the **complete gift** which our Lord purchased for us: *unfettered access to an eternal relationship with our loving heavenly Father*.

During this festive season, let us pursue and offer this ultimate JOY!

### **Angel's Story - A Testimony of God's Faithfulness** Written by Linda Flood

In honor of November being National Adoption Month here is a special story from Linda Flood.

I was asked to write about our adoption experience, so here goes.

First of all, my name is Linda Flood, and I've been married to Bob Flood for 38 years. We have 7 biological children and adopted Angel 10 years ago when she was 8.

When our youngest son, Josiah was 12, I found myself deeply consumed with a home improvement project. All the kids were in school. The oldest three were already off to college and out of the house. Bob and I both thought 7 was a really nice number and we were content with being done growing our family.

So here I was, working on this project, listening to WEMI Christian radio. They were airing a program called Family Life, and the guest was sharing their adoption story. I had heard many adoption stories in the past and never got very emotional over any of them, but for some reason, I started crying as this story was being told. I cannot remember one single word that was spoken, only that I felt overwhelming emotions and could not stop crying. I was kind of baffled by this, so I simply asked God what is going on? Why am I crying about this? Instantly the Holy Spirit spoke to my heart, not with an audible voice, but straight to my spirit, "Would you be willing to welcome an orphan into your home?"

Whoa! I did not see that coming! I had never entertained the idea of adoption before. It kind of buckled me at the knees - so much so that I had to go sit down and breathe. I was really sure God knew that we had 7 kids already, so I knew I didn't need to inform Him of this, but I did anyway! After regaining my composure, I thought to myself, the only reason God would ask me this is because He wanted to bring another child to us to care for. So, I answered very carefully, "If you want me to, I will!" Once again, the Holy Spirit answered me immediately, "Whoever welcomes a child in my name welcomes Me." My answer was also immediate: "ABSOLUTELY! My answer is YES! Absolutely YES! Lord, I want you to be welcomed in my home in whatever form you choose, so sign me up".

That brief, yet profound, dialogue with God kept me from quitting about 100 times. The next 3 1/2 years were laced with frustration, anger, fear, confusion, doubt, (did I mention frustration?). The paperwork, red tape, social workers dropping the ball, deadlines expiring and paperwork having to be done all over, 30 hours of mandatory (for each of us) education hours being lost and needing to be done over, but then being increased to 60 each!

"Lord", I said, "why is this so hard? It seems to me, if you asked me to do this, it should be easy. I don't understand why I am met with opposition at every turn. This feels like a big mistake. It feels like I do not have your favor with this. I am very conflicted here, Lord. I don't understand why this is so hard. I could sure use your help right now." Instantly (again), the Lord answered me with scripture. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall make your path straight." I had to repeat that verse about 100 times over the remainder of the adoption process. I was learning to walk by faith, and not by feelings. I was not a quick learner. It felt a lot like trying to write with my left foot.

I came so very, very close to bailing out. It was just too hard, too long, too frustrating, but I kept remembering that verse "Whoever welcomes a child in my name welcomes me". I kept remembering my answer, "ABSOLUTELY YES!" How could I tell God I changed my mind? How could I tell Him no? That would be like saying, "You are not welcome in my home after all."

By God's grace, I did not quit, and finally the day came when we were told we had the green light. Go ahead and book your flights. I was scared to death and told God so. He said He would go before me and hem me in behind. Sure enough. From that point on, the rest of the journey was a breeze. It felt like we were walking on air. We flew to Hong Kong to bring Angel home. The transition was seamless. The social worker in Hong Kong said she had never seen such a smooth transition. Ten years later, Angel continues to amaze us with her ability to roll with whatever comes along. She has been a constant source of joy that she cannot contain. It splashes out on everyone who gets to know her or even just meets her briefly.

I am so thankful God did not let me quit.

# The Anchor Holds

#### "How rare it is to find a soul quiet enough to hear God speak." Francois Feneion

As each of us awakens to a new day, even before we open our eyes or get out of bed, our minds are already at work, comprehending what might happen in this new adventure called "today". Our waking thoughts immediately remind us of the litany of things that will be thrown in our path and requiring our action. And of course, Satan is right there too, with his supply of negative thoughts, *hoping that he will control* our day. For many, this day may hold the pleasant experiences of a day trip, a special visit from a friend, or some other fun time. For some, this day may be filled with the trials and unpleasant experiences of medical treatments, or job searching, maybe a court appearance, or some other difficult task. Each of our days are different, and there are no assurances of what kind of day this day will be - nor tomorrow, or the next day, or the next.

There isn't much - in fact, there isn't anything - that this world can guarantee us, and we are left to handle what ever our day may bring. But there is one thing that is a certainty - and that is **the love of God** and the very fact that He stands fully prepared to supply all we will need to get through. His word says ... "BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD!" (Psalm 46:10)

We, who profess that we are Christians, children of the Almighty God, have all the resources of our Heavenly Father at our call. God's call for us to "be still" means that He desires that we separate ourselves from today's activities and take time to quietly pause at the day's beginning, allowing God to touch us with His goodness and grace. I believe God has put, in each of us, a "quiet place" where we can go to meet Him, fellowship with Him, and prepare ourselves for the day that lays before us. It serves to remind me of the situations of us many find ourselves on any given day, like the struggle and the difficulty of trying to stay positive when the circumstances you are facing want to drag you down and cause you to give up hope.

Could you be going through a similar situation?




